

CLYDE QUAY SCHOOL (#2827)

Enrolment Scheme Description

Effective from 03 May 2005

Amended 20 July 2026

The guidelines for development and operation of enrolment schemes are issued under the Education and Training Act 2020 for the purpose of describing the basis on which the Secretary's powers in relation to enrolment schemes will be exercised.

Home Zone

All students who live within the home zone described below (and shown on the attached map) shall be eligible to enrol at the school.

In a clockwise direction:

- The boundary begins at the Town Belt and follows the Town Belt south to Paterson Street, including both sides of Ellice Street and Austin Terrace.
- The boundary continues west to Kent Terrace.
- From the intersection of Kent Terrace, Wakefield Street and Oriental Parade, the boundary follows Wakefield Street west, including odd-numbered addresses only, to Tory Street.
- The boundary follows Tory Street south, including even-numbered addresses only, to Courtenay Place.
- From Courtenay Place, the boundary continues west along Courtenay Place and into Dixon Street, including even-numbered addresses only, to Cuba Street.
- The boundary follows Cuba Street north, including both sides, to Wakefield Street.
- From Wakefield Street, the boundary continues east, including even-numbered addresses from number 132, and connects to Jervois Quay, where only odd-numbered addresses are included. Pringle Avenue is not included.
- From Jervois Quay, the boundary follows Harris Street to the coastal edge, then continues along Ara Moana to Clyde Quay Wharf and Herd Street.
- The boundary follows the coastal edge along Oriental Parade to number 154 Oriental Parade.
- The boundary continues north along Moeller Street, including both sides up to and including number 12, and includes both sides of Shannon Street.

- The boundary then returns to the Town Belt at the starting point.

Special Programmes

This priority category is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a Special programme approved by the Secretary.

Out of Zone Enrolments

Each year the Board of Trustees will determine the number of places which are likely to be available in the following year for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. The Board will publish this information by notice. The notice will indicate how applications are to be made and will specify a date by which all applications must be received.

Applications for enrolments will be processed in the following order of priority:

- **First Priority** This priority is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a special programme approved by the Secretary for Education.
- **Second Priority** will be given to applicants who are siblings of current students.
- **Third Priority** will be given to applicants who are siblings of former students.
- **Fourth Priority** will be given to any applicant who is a child of a former student of the school.
- **Fifth Priority** will be given to any applicant who is either a child of an employee of the board of the school or a child of a member of the board of the school.
- **Sixth Priority** will be given to all other applicants.

If there are more applicants in the second, third, fourth or fifth priority groups than there are places available, Selection within the priority group will be by ballot conducted in accordance with instructions by the Secretary. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by notice.

Applicants seeking second or third priority status may be required to give proof of a sibling relationship.
