Conference TX Highlights

He tino koa taku ngākau ki te hoki mai ki to tātou kura. After two weeks away first at the *Council for Exceptional Children's* (CEC) *conference* then a taster of schools in Celina TX, it's always good to return to our kura.

There were many highlights obviously seeing a school in action was at the top. I visited and met with Jennifer Zorens, the principal of *Dr. Jack Cockrill Middle School* (CMS) in McKinney TX. It is home to 1300 students, 120 teachers, grade 6-8 (12-14 year olds). The Cowboys are the school's Mascot. I visited Aroha Nahoolewa who teaches grade 6 mathematics. Like our secondary schools, the teachers are subject specialists and State wide testing is the part and parcel of the curriculum; has been for years.

This school also has special education teachers and para-professionals who teach with *exceptional children*. Their classrooms were referred to as self-sufficient and partial integration into general classrooms occur.

Classrooms, library, café, gymnasium (wow), counsellor and nurses' rooms are totally enveloped inside. Security is the operative word. The photos capture the expanse of the site.






















Order your child's school photo


Just a friendly reminder that the fundraising period will be closing for school photographs on **Thursday** <u>4th of April 2024</u> at midnight.


CONCRETE JUNGLE

What's believed to be the biggest school mural in the Southern Hemisphere is gradually covering all available walls at Clyde Quay School in Mt Victoria - thanks to support from your City Council. The mural was started in 1997 by Clyde Quay Caretaker Robert Stewart with the help of finance from the Council's Creative Communities Grant scheme. "There's not a lot of greenery or space at Clyde Ouay we wanted to make the playground feel more open," says Robert. So far he's done that spectacularly with a mural that covers a wide range of subjects from astronomy to natural history and Maori legend. Senior pupils and PD workers can all take credit for helping to create the mural. When finally completed it will cover 900sq metres. Apart from the City Council, support has also been given by Mitre 10 Vivian St and Resene Paints.
