# New Zealand Portrait Gallery By Lukas and Harriet

We went on an impromptu trip to the art gallery a few weeks ago, to look at some abstract art pieces, which we are now creating ourselves.

We looked at some paintings that tell us what happened in the past and told us about stuff that we haven't learned yet like the Waikato Wars . The pieces on the Waikato War were spread across twelve canvases, each a very different colour and often painted with a certain style so it has a metaphorical meaning. There was also part of the exhibition on small chalkboards. These depicted memorable moments from his schooling, childhood and history at the time. One of the chalkboards had a comment from the artist's school report. It says, "Richard is continually falling off his chair in class." There was also an enormous NZ flag with the words (or similar to), "I cannot have a future without reconciling with my past." Britta: "Art is beautiful, but not all art can suck you in like Richard's did"


Tarika: "Each piece of art has a hidden meaning behind the canvas"

Work is planned to start in the mid of April to create a Raised Pedestrain Crossing. The work will invlove changes to the existing crossing to a raised crossing with flood lights outside Clyde Quay School.

Construction is expected to be completed in mid-May. Work hours will generally be Monday to Friday, 7am to 6pm.

To do this work we need the site to be clear of vehicles and other obstructions so parking will be affected.
