what goes up must come down (unless it's a helium balloon)

unless it's superman

first laws

an object will stay at rest unless an uneven force is acted upon it.

uneven forces

a 'thing' that has weight and motion

hypothesis: correct

if the tennis ball is touching the basketball they will when they touch the ground the basketball will do it first because its heavier and the tennis ball will bounce on the basketball

observations:

force of it going down + force of basketball going up = big bounce

material of balls

dropped approx. 2 metres high bounced approx. 5 metres high

my hypothesis was correct, though it bounced a lot higher than expected. (see here)

Second law:

Acceleration is directly proportional to the net force applied, and inversely proportional to the mass. $F_{net} = ma$

pre-hypothesis 2.0:

The weight will would not move the tube normally, but the jolt of it stopping will tip the tube over the edge.


